

### What to Expect

We hope that this printable list will prepare you for the questions you will be asked during the funeral arrangements. We have put the questions into a table for you to allow you space to make notes if you wish. This list is intended as a guide only, you can contact us at any stage for further advice and assistance. As well as this list, you may also wish to bring with you, should you choose own clothes, the clothes that you would like your loved one to wear.

Would you like to display a photo on the coffin during the service?	

Obituary notice - An obituary notice normally comes in 4 parts: Details of the deceased, family members, funeral arrangements and flowers or donations information. It may help to give some thought to which family members you wish to mention and to whether you would like to receive floral tributes or if donations, to which charity. Our staff will assist with the wording of the notice. Please use the box below to write down anything you wish to mention in the obituary.
